## Class updates

### Reception classes Acorn and Chestnut

Reception classes have enjoyed starting to make Christmas crafts, which involved the children having to paint their feet, they found this very funny.

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They have thought about the Christmas story and read different versions. The children enjoyed putting pictures into the correct order from this story in their RE work.

### Year 1 Willow and Hawthorn

This week Year 1 have enjoyed their walk around the village for Geography. In Art they have been learning about colour mixing and in English they have started to read the story 'Get Well Santa'.

They have also been learning about 3D shapes, the name of properties of each 3D shape, and that they are the same shape no matter which way they are orientated. They have been set the challenge of looking for different 3D shapes this weekend at home.



### Year 2 Sycamore and Maple

In RE this week Year 2 have been trying Latkes as part of their learning about the celebration of Hanukkah. They have thought about Latkes, what they are and what they signified.



### Year 3 Pine and Palm

In Year 3, the children have been developing some exciting new skills in their Design Technology lessons. Over the past few weeks, they have been designing and beginning to make a 'moving toy' for a small child. They have learnt about how mechanisms work and the role that cams play in

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the movement of an object. Their toys feature either an egg-shaped cam, a snail cam or an ellipse cam depending on each child's design. This week, they have been using new tools to construct the toys. They have used hot glue guns (with adult support) to secure the tabs of the box and to fix the designed background onto the box. They have also used small hack saws to cut a measured piece off of a metre long wooden dowel. This will be an integral part of the moving toys and the children took great care when using these tools. They are all very proud of the new skills they have gained and they are all very excited to see the finished products over the coming weeks.



### Year 4 Oak and Elm

As part of their History lessons the children in Year 4 have role played being archaeologists to find clues to reveal who was buried at Sutton Hoo in Suffolk and looking at a variety of sources to discover how Anglo Saxons lived in their villages. In English, the children wrote newspaper articles about the amazing discovery of a Victorian coin on our very own school field by Mr Pearson.



### Conifer Class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

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We read the story of The Red Beast this week which helped them to think about our anger; what can make our anger 'grow' and what helps it to reduce. The children really liked the story and thought very carefully about how their bodies feel when they are angry so that they can recognise this feeling and use one of their strategies to help them to regulate.

We made apple and raspberry smoothies in our cooking session this week, although some of the children were not very keen to try it despite it looking delicious!

### **Christmas Round the World**

Today the children in all classes have been learning about an international country they are focussing on and have spent time learning about how they celebrate Christmas in each location.

Reception: Africa

Year 1: Mexico

Year 2: Italy

Year 3: China

Year 4: Norway.



The children have discovered how the Christmas celebrations compare to their own. They have completed a whole range of activities such as making Christmas baubles and decorations in the style of the country, learning how to say 'Happy Christmas' in the language and finding out what children eat for Christmas dinner in these countries. The children are all now feeling very festive for the countdown to Christmas!

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## **Update regarding Childcare Choices and Help with Payments**

### **Childcare Choices: Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life**

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for.

The [Childcare Choices Website](#) brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare schemes together and get the most out of it.

And from next year even more help is on the way:

From **April 2024**, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.

From **September 2024**, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.

From **September 2025**, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children – from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as 'wraparound care'.

## **Protect Your Festive Season From Flu and COVID Message from the NHS**

As we gear up for the festive period, we would like to request support in ensuring the health and wellbeing of our school community, families, and young people.

The NHS are urgently calling on eligible individuals to get vaccinated against flu and COVID in preparation for the festive season.

With the vaccination taking two weeks to become effective, there is still time to have the vaccination and be protected in time for Christmas and the New Year celebrations.

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## Who is eligible for the free flu and COVID vaccination?

- those who are aged 65 and over
- people with certain health conditions or a learning disability
- pregnant people
- people who live with someone with a weakened immune system
- those in long stay residential care
- frontline health or social care workers
- carers

Most children can get the [children's flu vaccine](#). This includes children who were aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2023, school-aged children (Reception to Year 11) and children with certain health conditions.
