Reception Classes - Acorn and Chestnut

This week the children have continued to explore how to keep healthy. They enjoyed playing on the big playground with balls, skipping ropes and hula hoops and thinking about the effects, exercise has on our bodies. They have also thought about how to keep safe near roads, they practiced how to cross a road safely in their class rooms. Mrs McCracken and Mrs Gates enjoyed pretending to be cars in the road.

Year 1 - Hawthorn and Willow

Year 1 have been learning about subtracting this week using number lines and related facts that will help solve number sentences.

In History they have been they have been learning about Mathew Henson and how he was the first person to travel to the North Pole in 1909.

In PSHE year 1 have been learning about cooperating and playing cooperating games.

In English they have been reading Brown Bear Brown Bear and looking for adjectives.

Year 2 - Maple and Sycamore

In Year 2 this week they have been exploring texture when using primary and secondary colours and we have painted lots of different nature pictures after going on a nature walk outside.

They then used these pieces of nature artwork and created a group collage. Have a look at some of our work.

Year 3 - Palm and Pine

In Year 3, this week pupils have explored mummification as part of their History topic on Ancient Egypt. The children discovered the intricate process of preserving bodies for the afterlife and learnt about the significance of mummification in Egyptian culture, its rituals, and the beliefs surrounding death. Year 3 marvelled at the craftsmanship involved in creating mummies and gained a deeper understanding of how ancient civilizations honoured their deceased.

Year 4 - Elm and Oak

This week, the children have begun to look at instruction texts. They have followed instructions to create a clay eye and evaluated examples of instructions. In Maths, the children have begun to divide 2 digits by 1 digit using the part whole model and everyone has shown great resilience in our learning. In PE, the children have continued to practise their ball skills and worked on their tactics for success in a game of tennis.

Conifer class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

In our Hamish and Milo sessions, we have continued to think and learn about the feeling of anger. We linked these feelings to a volcano and watched a bottle of coca-cola explode when we shook it up – just like our anger feels sometimes! We made scones in our cooking session – some of the children tried them and liked them!

Some children have started to learn more about being safe online and what 'technology' is. We have looked at different uses of technology in our computing lessons. Other children have continued to access many of their lessons with their mainstream class.

Important information about measles

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Cases of measles are rising in England. Measles is **very** infectious and spreads easily between people who have not been vaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools.

Measles is a serious illness. Some children with measles need to be admitted to hospital. Measles can cause pneumonia and inflammation (swelling) of the brain. Sometimes it can cause long term health problems or death.

Measles is prevented by vaccination. Two MMR vaccinations provide excellent life-long protection from catching measles.

If your child has not been vaccinated and has close contact with someone with measles, they may be asked to stay at home and miss school or be kept away from childcare/nursery for 21 days. Vaccination can help keep your child in school or in childcare.

You can check your child's vaccinations by looking at their personal child health record (Red Book) or by asking your GP.

Your child needs two MMR vaccines to be fully protected. The first MMR vaccine is offered when children turn one. The second when they are about 3 years and 4 months old. If your child has missed one or both vaccines they can catch up at any time. Adults who have missed MMR vaccinations can still be vaccinated – it is never too late.
