Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

Reception classes have continued their topic about spring and have started to think about the animals that are born in spring like lambs, chicks, calves.


They had lots of fun during World book day sharing their book characters and stories with each other.

Year 1 – Hawthorn and Willow

In English we have begun to learn about 'Letters'. We have read a lovely book called 'Can I be your dog?' and talked about what the features of letters are.

In Maths we have been thinking about measure and how to compare using words like longer than and shorter than. In PSHE, we have been learning about personal hygiene and how we can do lots of things to try and keep well, including washing our hands and changing our clothes regularly. We have also been making special cards for our Mums.



Year 2 – Maple and Sycamore

In RE this week Year 2 have been reading about 3 miracles that Jesus performed. They have taken part in different activities to represent these miracles, they first listened to the story about Jesus feeding the 5000 and the children all ate some toast. The next story was about Jesus making a blind man see again and the children created clay faces to represent this. The final story was when a man was born deaf and Jesus helped him to hear and speak again, the children listened to music.

They also learned about following instructions and wrote instructions on how to make a cup of coffee and to make toast.

The children also enjoyed having a visit from Oak class on World book day where they read to our class.







Year 3 – Palm and Pine

Year 3 were extremely lucky to spend an immersive day visiting 3 different places of worship on the Queens Park Faith Tour. In the morning we were welcomed by the Imam of the Queens Park Mosque were we found out more about the beliefs and values of Muslims. The children had some brilliant questions to ask to deepen their understanding of Islam. Their next stop was All Saints Parish Church where we were allowed to wander and explore the building and look for items that are important to Christians, the Vicar spoke to us about important symbols in Christianity and even let us wear items of the vicar's uniform. Our last stop was the Gurdwara where we were greeted by Satty, a follower of Sikhism she explained some of the key principles of Sikhism and welcomed us into the meditation hall where we were lucky enough to view the very precious Guru Granth Sahib (the Sikh holy book). The children had a great time learning more about people with different values and beliefs.





Year 4 – Elm and Oak

In Year 4 this week, we have been reading Princess and the Pea. We have studied all the characters and thought about their own individual points of view of the story. In the next couple of weeks, we will be writing our own version of the story so we can use the words to put into our moving books in our DT lessons.

In Science, we have begun learning about teeth. We have discovered canines, incisors and molars and how they help us to eat.


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
