Hope you all have a restful weekend



Class updates

Reception classes Acorn and Chestnut

This week Reception classes have been reading the story of 'Goldilocks and the 3 Bears', they have completed some writing and also created their own bears.



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Year 1 Willow and Hawthorn

This week Year 1 have been learning about Linda Brown Buck (the Scientist) who discovered how our noses detect different smells. The children had lots of fun trying to identify the different smells like lemon, mint and vinegar.



Year 2 Sycamore and Maple

This week in Year 2 they have been making our finger puppets based on a fairy-tale characters, the children have experimented with different textures, materials and colours. They have had lots of fun!



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Year 3 Pine and Palm

Year 3 have been learning about Poems this week and have been performing them, making sure to use the right tone and pitch to enhance the meaning of the Poem.

Year 3 took part in the Creative Prayer Workshop and learnt lots about different ways we can pray.

Creative Prayer

On Wednesday, Year 3 and 4 had an exciting Creative Prayer workshop with the Impact (Bedford Area Schools Christian Support Trust). The children listened enraptured as they learnt about the power of prayer and the incredible connection it gives us with God. They explored the different ways that we can pray, the reasons why we might pray and when we might decide to pray. The children took part in various activities to support and develop their knowledge of prayer including: colouring prayer spinners with colours that represent the different things we are thankful for; writing thank you prayers for all the animals we love in the world; creating a list of the people who walk with us through our lives, who love us and guide us; and creating a list of positive things about ourselves, starting with each letter of our name. The children left the workshop inspired by the power of creative prayer.

Scholastic Book Fair

We have our Scholastic Book Fair taking place on the 22nd & 27th November for YR, Y1 and Y2 and 23rd & 28th November for YR 3 and 4.

Alongside the book fair we will have a stall for a selection of brand new toys which are available for £3 each. These toys are being sold by our PTA to raise money for outdoor play equipment for breaks and lunch times. To purchase these we will have a QR code or they can be purchased via contactless payment.



School Meals

We are unfortunately having an increasing number of meals being requested by children at lunchtime without orders being placed by their parents/carers through School Grid.

Our catering provider tries hard to minimise waste in order to keep costs down and so does not produce high numbers of spare meals each day. If your child does not have a meal ordered and we are unable to provide a meal as we have run out, we may need to call you to bring in a packed lunch.

Please could we therefore ask for your co-operation to ensure that if you would like your child to have a school meal that you place an order before 8.55am each day. Meals can also be ordered weekly or monthly.

Healthy food for snacks and lunches and Nut Free

We have had a few children recently who have brought sweets into school as part of their lunch box and also energy drinks or fizzy drinks. Please be aware that the children are not allowed to bring any fizzy or energy drinks into school or sweets. We are also a **nut free** school so please do not send children any snacks which contain nuts, we do have children with allergies in the school and this can pose a risk to life if they come into contact with nuts.

Update regarding Childcare Choices and Help with Payments

Childcare Choices: Get the help that fits your family, so you can juggle work and life

Thousands of families could be saving money on their childcare costs. But some simply don't know what support they might be eligible for.

The [Childcare Choices Website](#) brings together all the existing childcare offers in one place, so parents can get the help that fits their family. This could be through Tax-Free Childcare, 30 Hours Childcare, or Universal Credit Childcare. Some families might be eligible to use more than one childcare schemes together and get the most out of it.

And from next year even more help is on the way:

From **April 2024**, eligible working parents in England with children aged 2 will have access to 15 hours childcare.

From **September 2024**, the 15 hours childcare offer will be expanded to eligible working parents in England with children between 9 and 23 months old.

From **September 2025**, eligible working parents in England with children between 9 months up to school age will have access to 30 hours childcare.

Support is also expanding for primary-school aged children – from September 2024, parents are expected to see an expansion in the availability of childcare in their local area before and after school, between 8am and 6pm, also known as '**wraparound care**'.
