#### Class updates

#### **Reception classes Acorn and Chestnut**

This week reception classes have learnt about Diwali. The children enjoyed making Rangoli patterns with colourful rice and Diva lamps using paints.

#### Year 1 Willow and Hawthorn

This week Year 1 have been reading the sound collector by Roger McGough, which is the world going silent. The children have been using verbs and nouns to create their own sounds 'stole the stamping of the feet' and 'the bouncing of the ball'

In Maths they have been looking at numbers bonds up to 10 and in Geography they have been looking at the local area and simple maps.

#### **Year 2 Sycamore and Maple**

This week we have learnt how to make felt, we have followed instructions and been able to create our own patterns in the felt.



#### How to make felt

- 1) Lay the bubble wrap bubble-side up on the table
- 2) Start with approx 10 g of wool roving to make the base for their felt map square.
- Tease out thin pieces of wool fibre and lay them on the bubble wrap, placing the fibres in the same direction.
- 4) Make another layer on top, this time placing the wool fibres in the opposite direction
- 5) Repeat to make 3 or 4 layers.
- 6) Add colour and detail using colourful wool, keeping the design simple and the shapes quite big.
- 7) Try twisting fibres to make lines or smaller details.
- 8) Next lay a piece of net-curtain fabric over the top of the wool.
- 9) Add hot water to the centre of the wool.
- 10) Push down and out towards the edges of the wool, adding water until itl feels wet all the way through.
- 11) Add a small amount of grated soap and work it into the wool
- 12) Remove the net curtain. Rearrange your design if necessary.
- 13) Roll up the felt tightly inside the bubble wrap.
- 14) Roll the tea-towel tightly around the bubble wrap and secure it with elastic bands
- 15) Now roll the felt inside the tea towel as if you were rolling out dough, pressing down firmly.
- 16) Unroll the tea towel then re-roll the felt in the opposite direction. Wrap the tea towel around it and repeat the process at least four times.
- 17) Once the felt has shrunk, it can be left to dry completely.











#### Year 3 Pine and Palm

This week in Year 3 English lessons the children have been getting creative with their adjectives. They have been coming up with powerful adjectives to describe settings and turning these into expanded noun phrases. They have really enjoyed creating exciting ways to describe Neverland.

#### Year 4 Oak and Elm

Year 4 have started a new topic in science on sound and using data loggers to record sounds going around the school – loud and quiet noises.

In English they have started a new story called The journey – our journey has no pictures. They are writing descriptions using prepositions and fronted adverbials.

#### **Conifer Class**

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

In Geography lessons in the afternoons this week the children have been looking at maps and atlases.

This week the children have enjoyed making bonfire cupcakes.
