It was wonderful to welcome so many family members to our Harvest service on Wednesday where we were able to join together in song to say thank you for the harvest. Thank you all so much for your extremely generous donations to the local food banks, we know that the food is gratefully received.

I also have some amazing news regarding the funds raised by the Autumn Fair....

The grand total for the Autumn Fair is an incredible £4,787.97 !!!!

Thank you all so much for supporting the fair and making it such a fantastic event. We are delighted to share that we now have sufficient funds to go ahead with the Forest School developments. Work is scheduled to start in mid November which we are so pleased about. We have also been able to purchase a wellbeing resource called 'Hamish & Milo Well Being Intervention'. The complete Hamish & Milo Wellbeing Intervention programme includes ten emotion theme packs supporting children with difficulties with; friendship, resilience, anxiety, diversity, angry feelings, change, conflict, loss, sadness and self-esteem. The programme costs £995 and will be used to help children across the whole school. We couldn't buy these resources with the hard work of the PTA and families supporting the events.

We look forward to seeing you for the parent consultation evenings over the next few weeks.





Year 3 Pine and Palm

Together the whole class has made carrot soup and enjoyed trying this together.


General information

Harvest collection

Climbing Frame

Please can we remind all parents/carers that children are not allowed to use the climbing frame while waiting for drop off or collection. The climbing frame and equipment in the playground is there for use during school hours and with teacher supervision. We have often seen a large number of children on these items who are not supervised and this could lead to accidents. Thank you for your understanding.

Parking in the car park

We have noticed a number of parents have been parking in the school car park, please can we ask that you do not park in the car park. Using the car park while children are coming into and out of school can be unsafe for the children as they will often run and could not be seen. Please use alternative parking spaces which are in the local area to park and safely walk your child into school.

School Uniform

This is just a reminder of our School uniform, children should wear grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress. White shirt or polo shirt, maroon cardigan or sweatshirt. Pale blue and white gingham dresses or grey shorts may be worn for the Summer Term. White or grey socks complete the uniform.

Trainers **should not** be worn as general school footwear. We also ask that boots of any type are not worn in school. If bad weather conditions necessitate the wearing of boots whilst travelling to school please ensure school shoes are sent in to change into on arrival.

All uniform can be purchased from **Prestige**. Pinafores, skirts, shorts and trousers can also be purchased from most department stores/supermarkets.

Our PE kit is plain black shorts or girl's skort, the school's PE Polo Shirt or plain white T-shirt and trainers are required.

Black tracksuits may be worn for outdoor activities during the winter months.

PE items of clothing <u>must not</u> display logos (other than the school logo), branding or embellishments.

On PE days children are asked to come into school dressed in their PE kit. They will be allowed to wear this kit all day.

Please make sure that **every** item of clothing is clearly named.

The PTA also holds regular pre loved uniform sales where uniform can be bought at a small cost.

NON UNIFORM DAYS

On awarded non uniform days we respectfully ask that pupils come into school wearing appropriate clothing and footwear for the school day. Dependant on the season please ensure outerwear such as coats and jackets are also provided. **Team sports kits of any kind are not permitted to be worn.**
