Class updates

Reception classes Acorn and Chestnut

Reception classes have learnt about remembrance and labelled pictures of Poppies. They have made poppy potato print pictures. The children walked very sensibly to church and enjoyed their first remembrance service.

Year 1 Willow and Hawthorn

Year 1 have continued working on their nonfiction work looking at facts about animals and recording the facts in writing.

In DT they have been looking at moving mechanisms in books and made Gingerbread Man sliding mechanisms. Some of the children enjoyed this so much they went home and made new ones to bring in and show everyone.

Year 2 Sycamore and Maple

Year 2 enjoyed their watch me learn session and continued to real 'The Owl who was afraid of the Dark' they enjoyed using the dictionaries to look up words and find out what they meant.

In Geography they have been looking at continents and have enjoyed learning the continent song.

Year 3 Pine and Palm

This week Year 3 have been using their mapping and compass skills in geography. The children have been using 8 point compasses to find precise directions, they have also identified symbols on ordnance survey maps and had lots of fun giving each other directions.

Year 4 Oak and Elm

This week we have discovered more about our main character 'Ruskin' in our story Krindlekrax. He wants to be the hero of story but he could not be described as a typical hero.

We have planned to write a sequel to the story 'Journey' where the girl draws herself into new lands.

In science, we have discovered how sounds are made using cymbals, rice, drums and tuning forks!

In Maths, we have begun our new unit on Area and in DT, we have begun to investigate a range of light boxes and how we can illuminate them in readiness for designing our own.

Conifer Class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

We have been thinking about conflict resolution in our Hamish and Milo sessions.

We cooked biscuits in the shape of poppies this week and made a wreath as part of our Remembrance Day activities.
