Class updates

Reception classes Acorn and Chestnut

This week Reception classes have created artwork by rolling conkers in paint and then rolling them down drainpipes to create pictures. They have continued their work with phonics and now are beginning to read books with words.



Year 1 Willow and Hawthorn

In Maths they have been learning about 'part, part, whole' and how many parts make a whole number. In Science they have been learning about similarities and differences in animals.

They have continued to learn about old and new toys and creating a timeline for themselves, their parents and Grandparents about which toys they each played with.

Year 4 advance notice

After October half term year 4 will be making light boxes in DT, each child will need a shoe box, if you have any spare shoe boxes please can you bring them into school by the 10th November.

Also after half term we will be in need of old magazines and chocolate wrappers for another activity that we will be doing, please can any donations be brought in over the next week if possible.

Viking day will be held on the 16th Febuary and each child is asked to dress as a Viking, you do not need to buy an outfit an oversized t-shirt with a belt would be a great costume.

Flu Immunisation Day

The School Immunisation Team have confirmed that our school immunisation date will be 27th November.

As Y4 will be at Hazard Alley that day we have requested an additional date for the team to come back into school. If they can accommodate our request it is likely to be in December. If they are not able to come back into school they will provide details of local catch up clinics.

School Uniform

This is just a reminder of our School uniform; children should wear grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress. White shirt or polo shirt, maroon cardigan or sweatshirt. Pale blue and white gingham

dresses or grey shorts may be worn for the Summer Term. White or grey socks complete the uniform.

Trainers **should not** be worn as general school footwear. We also ask that boots of any type are not worn in school. If bad weather conditions necessitate the wearing of boots whilst travelling to school please ensure school shoes are sent in to change into on arrival.

All uniform can be purchased from **Prestige**. Pinafores, skirts, shorts and trousers can also be purchased from most department stores/supermarkets.

Our PE kit is plain black shorts or girl's skort, the school's PE Polo Shirt or plain white T-shirt and trainers are required.

Black tracksuits may be worn for outdoor activities during the winter months.

PE items of clothing <u>must not</u> display logos (other than the school logo), branding or embellishments.

On PE days children are asked to come into school dressed in their PE kit. They will be allowed to wear this kit all day.

Please make sure that every item of clothing clearly named.

NON UNIFORM DAYS

On awarded non uniform days we respectfully ask that pupils come into school wearing appropriate clothing and footwear for the school day. Dependant on the season please ensure outerwear such as coats and jackets are also provided. **Team sports kits of any kind are not permitted to be worn.**

Climbing Frame

Please can we remind all parents/carers that children are not allowed to use the climbing frame while waiting for drop off or collection. The climbing frame and equipment in the playground is there for use during school hours and with teacher supervision. We have often seen a large number of children on these items who are not supervised and this could lead to accidents. Thank you for your understanding.

Parking 197

We have noticed a number of parents have been parking in the school car park, please can we ask that you do not park in the car park. Using the car park while children are coming into and out of school can be unsafe for the children as they will often run and could not be seen. Please use alternative parking spaces which are in the local area to park and safely walk your child into school.

Please be respectful and mindful of our neighbours and do not park on their driveways or blocking their driveways, only use designated parking spaces in the local area.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14(1) <u>CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE COUNCIL</u> (BEDFORD ROAD, SILSOE) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2023

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Central Bedfordshire Council has made an Order the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle, except a vehicle being used for fire, police or ambulance purposes in an emergency, from proceeding along the length of Bedford Road, Silsoe between Clophill Roundabout and Jet Garage.

This temporary closure is required to enable full carriageway reconstruction and drainage works to take place and shall apply to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by the appropriate traffic signs. Where possible access will be maintained to property and premises but may be restricted from time to time according to local signing.

It is expected that the works will take place from 20 to 30 October 2023. The road will be closed at all times during this period.

The alternative route for this closure is via A507, A1, A602, A505, A5528, A6 and vice versa.

The Order will come into operation on 20 October 2023 for a period of eighteen months or until the proposed works have been completed, as detailed above, whichever is the earlier.
