Class updates

Reception classes Acorn and Chestnut

This week reception classes have learnt the sounds of S, A, T and P through phonemes.

They have also had lots of fun taking part in their first PE lesson in the hall and learning about space and movement.

Year 1 Willow and Hawthorn

In maths this week year 1 have been learning about representation of numbers using counters.

In English they have started to read the book 'How to catch a monster' and had lots of fun recreating sections by acting it out.

Year 2 Sycamore and Maple

This week year 2 have started a new topic in RE about 'How do we show care to others' and learning through discussions and other activities

In History they have been looking at the history of Wrest Park and building our knowledge about our local historical site.

Year 3 Pine and Palm

In English they have been washing dinosaurs, this has helped them to generate adverbs like scrub, rub and dip.

In History they have been learning more about hunter gatherers and in maths focusing on place values.

Year 4 Oak and Elm

In year 4's English lessons they have been looking at poems and comparing the techniques in the poems which use metaphors and similes.

In Art they were drawing with scissors which the classes really enjoyed and in PE they started to learn how to play Tag rugby and will continue with these lessons next week.

Conifer Class

In Conifer class they have enjoyed cooking this week, making cheese and tomatoes scrolls following on from their fruit kebabs last week.

Some of the children in the class have joined in with the mainstream classes and really enjoyed taking part in their class activities.

They have also enjoyed taking part in sunshine circles and learning more about phonics.

KS2 French

Year 3 are beginning their language journey by learning French so that by the end of year 6 they will have achieved all the 12 targets in the






National Curriculum. We focus on all 4 skills- Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. We play lots of games and try to speak as much French as possible.

We have a new special French bear in each Year 3 class called 'Camembert'. Each week, Mrs. Ashwell will choose a child who has worked hard and put lots of effort into their French. They will take Camembert's special book home and in their next French lesson they will have the honour of looking after 'Camembert'. The children are learning this half term about France, how to greet each other, how to say their name, numbers 1-10 and their colours.

In Year 4, the children are continuing to increase the amount of French they know. This half term, they will be practising their greetings, saying and writing where they live, how old they are as well as their nationality. Each week, Mrs McCarthy will award a child from each Year 4 class with a French badge for excellent effort with their French. They will be able to wear the badge all week and in the following lesson they can, if they wish, wear a red or blue beret.
