Year 1 have been practicing for the Harvest Festival with Mrs Ashwell in the music room.


They have continued to look at the history of toys. In Maths they have been using different vocabulary to explain fewer and more.

Conifer Class have been taking part in different activities such as playing games and learning how to work together and not just individually.


Some of the children have been looking at lunch boxes in DT and thinking about what makes a lunch box a good design and what could improve the design.

French



- Help with money
- Look after their brothers and sisters
- Offer other practical and emotional support.
- Collecting and giving medications
