#### A REMINDER ABOUT PUNCTUALITY

Excellent attendance and punctuality at school is something we want for all of our children. If children are late to school it can impact on their learning and their self-esteem. As you are already aware, we monitor children's attendance regularly and robustly and we do the same with punctuality. Children start school at 8.45am and we expect them to be in their classrooms, ready to start learning by 8.55am. The playground gates are locked at 8.55am so as a reminder; if your child arrives at school after this time, you will need to go to Reception to sign in. If this is after 9am, this will be recorded as a 'late' in the register and you will be asked to provide a reason for the lateness. If your child is late into school they may miss the main teaching input into the lesson and this could impact upon your child's understanding and attainment, so please aim to be at school on time!

We really appreciate your support in raising the importance of good school attendance and punctuality with your children. If you need any support with this please speak to the class teacher or make an appointment to see Mrs Shires or Mrs Boyle.
